

Stage 2 works underway as we further our greening of Grey Street

With Stage 1 now complete, safety and improvement works have commenced on Stage 2 between Ernest and Glenelg Street. Stage 2 works will continue until 12 June 2023.

STAGE 2 WORKS

- Location: Grey Street (between Ernest and Glenelg Streets)
- Dates: until 12 June 2023
- Time: 6am 3pm, Monday Friday daily (no weekend works)
- Road Closures: Grey Street southbound lane closed (between Ernest and Glenelg Streets) - Detour via Little Stanley Street.

STAGE 2 WORKS WILL INVOLVE

- Median lighting: replacement of street lights in the centre median and installation of uplights at the base of every existing Kauri Pine tree.
- Landscaping: dedicated pedestrian crossing paths, irrigation and planting of new sub-tropical plants within the road median.
- Footpath upgrades: will proceed after Stage 4 in August.

As we move forward with the project, the Corporation will continue work with all stakeholders to minimise disruptions and provide regular project updates.

Investigations for preliminary design of bi-directional bikeway on Grey Street to begin

It's all happening on Grey Street!

South Bank Corporation has engaged engineering and design consultants, Mott MacDonald, along with engagement and communications consultants, The Comms Team to help us undertake preliminary design investigations for a bi-directional bikeway and new public realm on Grey Street.

The bikeway project is for preliminary design only and is not yet a committed project.

Over the coming weeks, South Bank Corporation and its consultants will meet with key precinct and industry stakeholders to discuss and explore issues and opportunities of the bikeway and streetscape design.

Stakeholder feedback will inform the draft preliminary design for the bikeway, which is planned for release to the public for consultation in late 2023.

This design project supports the long-term master plan vision idea for Grey Street to make cycling and walking safer, slow traffic and make it Australia's 'coolest' and most vibrant sub-tropical street. It also supports the Corporation's continued commitment to creating a more active community at South Bank with improved travel connections.

The design project, which is for a preliminary design only and not a committed project, is jointly funded by the Department of Transport and Main Roads.

Update: Future South Bank Master Plan



South Bank Corporation is well through its review of the Stage 2 consultation process for the future South Bank master plan.

The Corporation is working closely with the Queensland Government on the analysis of all feedback received that will help inform the final master plan, which is expected to be finalised for consideration by government in late 2023.
